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# Value Added Course on Social Awareness & Obligations of an Indian Citizen for the Students of B.A General Programme 2023

COURSE STRUCTURE: The total Value Added Course of the B.A General Programme is divided into 22 lecture sessions each of 90 minutes (Total 33 hrs.).
