Title: Sensitization Programme on Gender Issues and Sexual Harassment

Gender Sensitization Workshop in the Department of Chemistry

The above workshops, conducted by Debapratim Chakraborty, Assistant Professor of the English Department and a member of the ICC focused primarily on the issue of consent and harassment and aimed at making the students understand the finer nuances of the issue. Various aspects of the topic were introduced by presenting imaginary scenarios to which the students were asked to respond according to their own understanding of consent. The instructor then amended their responses as necessary and further illustrated the points by showing film clips, popular memes, animations etc. and narrating anecdotes which would be easily relatable to the students. The participants were also made aware of the role of the ICC as a support system available to them.

Evidence of success: Students, particularly the girls, participated enthusiastically bringing their own views and personal experiences into the discussion. A short quiz was conducted at the end of each session to gauge their understanding of the subject. After attending the workshops the participants gained an enhanced awareness of issues relating to gender and sexual harassment and the resources available for their support which will definitely help in creating a safer work environment for the students.
