



Guidelines for Paper Presentation

- 1. The contribution should reflect its title clearly and the subtheme under which it falls has to be specifically mentioned.
- 2. The contribution must include the author's full name, designation, affiliation, email id and phone no. (Certificate will be issued as given)
- The main article should be within 3000-4000 words including reference (end note) and bibliography, diagrams, tables etc. and should be accompanied by an abstract within 200-250 words and 5 keywords maximum.
- Contribution would be either in English or Bengali.
- (a) For English- A4 page, Font -Times New Roman, Size-(Body)-12, abstract-10, Line Spacing- 1.5
 - (b) For Bengali- A4 page, Font -AVRO/ Bangla word, Size-(Body)-11, abstract-10, Line Spacing- 1.5
