Academic Audit for the Year 2021-22 [July 2021 – June 2022]

- 2 Very limited space (lecture rooms as well as practical laboratories) for running PG & UG classes simultaneously.
- 3 Allotted research laboratories are already occupied by various instruments. No extra vacant space is there for purchase of further sanctioned instruments & furniture. Practical laboratories should be renovated & modernized.
- 4 Financial assistance to the students is not satisfactory.

- 1 The infrastructural limitation is weakening the learning process. For instance, due to lack of classrooms the Faculties face problems in taking classes simultaneously. This has made the routine very inelastic. Sometimes remedial classes are conducted during vacation also to bridge the gap and address various needs of the students.
- ² Due to lack of a computer laboratory, the final year students face serious difficulty while doing their project. Also it is difficult for the students to learn software programming. At present the Department has only one computer functioning. At times it becomes tedious to balance administrative works and taking computer practical classes with one computer.
- 3 Under Choice based Credit system (CBCS) students of final year has the freedom to choose different optional papers. However due to faculty constraint the Department at present can offer only limited optional papers in DSE course in each of Sem V and Sem VI. Applied Econometrics, Public Economics are offered in Sem V and Contemporary Development Economics in Sem VI. The other papers on Health and Financial Economics which are emerging areas in Economics can also be offered


