This has made the routine very inelastic. Sometimes remedial classes are conducted during vacation also to bridge the gap and address various needs of the students. 2. Due to lack of a computer laboratory, the final year students face serious difficulty while doing their project. Also it is difficult for the students to learn software programming. At present the Department has only one computer functioning. At times it becomes tedious to balance administrative works and taking computer practical classes with one computer. 3.
