

MINUTES
IQAC Meeting of Barasat Government College
held on 16 August, 2022

1. **Dr Abhijit De** (IQAC Coordinator) reported to the house that a room (Room No. 402, 3rd Floor, Annexe Building, Barasat Government College) has been identified with sufficient arrangements (Furniture items, 3 Steel Almirahs, 1 Steel Cabinet with shelves and Glass cover, Ceiling Fans and Air-Conditioners) in order to facilitate holding of IQAC Meetings by accommodating the members of the IQAC, Heads of the Departments, and other respected attending members. Moreover, other IQAC related matters and official processes can also be conveniently conducted in the same room. This is proposed to the Honourable **Principal (Dr Samar Chattopadhyay)** and he immediately gave his consent for the same.
2. **Dr Madhusudan Ghosh** (NAAC Coordinator) communicated to the members of the house to enhance the processes parameters for preparation of Academic Audit by all the Departments and inform for any shortcomings which can be sorted out through coordinated efforts.
3. **Dr Madhusudan Ghosh** (NAAC Coordinator) also suggested that the **Puja vacation of the college may be utilized to conduct value added courses in different departments** without affecting the regular academic schedule of the college. It was resolved that a few value-added courses will be conducted in the month of October, 2022.
- ✓ 4. **Dr Abhijit De** (IQAC Coordinator) suggested that the **Action Taken Reports for the Academic Year: 2021-22** be prepared by IQAC on the analysis of college infrastructural feedback from students, teachers, parents and alumni by **30th November 2022**. The departmental heads will be requested to submit the action taken reports on the academic feedback (for Teacher's evaluation) by students of each department to IQAC within the **25th November 2022**.
5. Under the context of matters arising, two aspects were discussed. Firstly, **Dr Samar Chattopadhyay** (Principal) expressed to the house that we will soon be getting directives from the Higher Education Department (HED) to conduct Offline Workshop on NAAC. So, we will have to prepare our ground work and gather the solved and unsolved NAAC & IQAC related matters by all the Departments of Barasat Government College.
6. Secondly, **Dr Swati Mitra** (Head, Department of English) declared that it will be possible to organise an Awareness Program on Cyber Crime with the association of Barasat Police Department by end of 1st week of September 2022 in collaboration with IQAC, Barasat Government College for the benefit of students and College members. Initial communication with the resource persons are already being done and we are looking for a nearest possible date to hold the program.
7. **Dr. Samrajnee Dutta** has proposed for opening of a "**Science Club**" which will help to create a common platform for the discourse of scientific knowledge, innovative thinking and promotion of scientific temperament especially for all science students and in multidiscipline ultimately leading to Holistic Development. She says that, the **Science Club** can act as a conduit for such sharing of expertise and information and in the process build an organization of co-operative innovativeness. She also suggested that, the Science Club can be formed initially comprises of students of the UG and PG departments of Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Geography and Economics with the voluntary participation.

MINUTES

Extended IQAC meeting of Barasat Government College held on 24. 01. 2023

The meeting was held in the third floor IQAC room of the college's Annex building. It was presided over by the Principal (**Dr Samar Chattopadhyay**). The IQAC Coordinator (Dr Abhijit De), the Teachers' Council Secretary (TCS - Dr Prabir Bhattacharjee) and several other members including the Principal of Barasat College were present.

1. From the very beginning of the meeting different aspects of the AQAR, to be submitted to the UGC in February, were discussed. When matters relating to psychological counselling of students was being discussed, **Dr. Samrajnee Dutta** suggested that the identities of students opting for their counselling be kept undisclosed.
2. **Dr. Madhusudan Ghosh** raised the issue of audit report. **Dr. Indranath Bhattacharya** queried about the authenticity of the report format. The data in that report, he pointed out, do not always match the NIRF data.
3. **Dr. Prabir Bhattacharya** emphasized the importance of rethinking students' admission in the next session. The tricky issue of how to stop Science students from leaving after they have blocked their seats was discussed.
4. The **IQAC Coordinator** expressed concern over the fact that a considerable chunk of work relating to AQAR submission is still pending. Assistance in editing the language of the text of certain sections of the AQAR was sought from the Department of English. It was also decided that Prof. Priyanka Sen will be contacted for quick submission of the job (AQAR editing) that she is handling at present.
5. While discussing placement related matters **Dr. Partha Dasgupta**, Principal of Barasat College, highlighted the fact that placement agencies unethically use the data they receive from colleges to further their own business interest and do little further to help students.
6. **Dr. Indranath Bhattacharya** pointed out the necessity of setting up a mechanism for acquiring data relating to students' progression in the college office. He also mentioned the importance of including non-teaching staff members in the team to expedite this job.
7. The **Assistant Engineer, PWD (Electrical)** joined the meeting for some time and made valuable contributions to the discussion regarding energy audit. Different issues relating to offline and online connection of solar panels came up in the discussion. He referred to energy audit as a continuous process. Intricacies of calculating energy consumption were discussed in detail by several members with calculation and illustrations.
8. **Dr. Abhijit De** (IQAC Coordinator) shared the **Analysis and Action taken Reports for the Academic Year: 2021-22 of the infrastructural and academic feedbacks of different stake holders** with the house and it is **unanimously accepted by the members** present in the meeting.
9. Next, the notification for the **foundation of Science Club** (which was created on **9th September, 2022**) was read out by **Dr. Madhusudan Ghosh**. Students' registration process has already been started through Google form and more than **150 students** are registered from different Departments. A WhatsApp Group is also created for the sharing of **Science Club** activities. One/two class Coordinator/s has been assigned from each Department for communication with Mentor (Teacher). The objective of this **Science Club** will be as follows:

"To create a common platform for the discourse of scientific knowledge, innovative thinking and promotion of scientific temperament especially for all science students and in multidiscipline ultimately leading to Holistic Development."
