Introduction: International Women's Day is celebrated worldwide on 8th March to celebrate the social, cultural, political contributions of women and raise awareness about the discrimination faced by women in patriarchal society. The students of the Department of English, Barasat Government College put up a vibrant cultural programme to commemorate this event.

Brief report on the programme (Different achievements and benefits of the programme):

The programme was conceived and executed by the students of the department who paid their tribute to the achievements of women and highlighted various aspects of gender based oppressions through a collage of dance, songs, poems and narration of personal experiences of gender discrimination faced by some of the female students. The teachers of the department in their speeches also discussed the history of women's movements and the significance of celebrating Women's Day. The programme brought alive the issues of feminism and women's rights that students encounter in the academic discussions of the classroom and helped them appreciate these topics better through direct engagement with these issues.

Title of the Programme : Under the Greenwood Tree: BARDS 2022 (A short Shakespearean Sojourn in Rabindranath's *Tasher Desh*)

Date of Programme : May 6, 2022

Introduction : This was a programme to celebrate the birth anniversaries of the two bards of the eastern and western parts of the world: Rabindranath Tagore of India and William Shakespeare of England. The English bard has his birthday on April 23, while his Bengali counterpart has it on May 7. The Department of English of Barasat Govt. College celebrates the birth anniversaries of these two bards by presenting selections from their works.

Brief report on the programme (Different achievements and benefits of the programme)

The programme began with a welcome address by Dr. Swaty Mitra, Assistant Professor of the Department of English. The Principal then made his address. It was followed by a skit directed by Dr. Swaty Mitra. Choreography was done by Debashrita Sen Gupta, a student of Semester 2. Students of the department took part in the actual presentation. They performed the dances together with rendition of songs composed by both the bards.
