

Special Lecture: "What is the Use of a Book without Pictures? The Alice Books and the History of Children's Literature in English"







Introduction: This special lecture was aimed at giving the students a broad overview of the development of Children's Literature in English during the Nineteenth Century as a supplement to their reading of Lewis Carroll's *Through the Looking Glass*.

Brief Report: The speaker outlined the history of Children's Literature and also discussed how illustrations played an important role in children's books and the subtexts that these pictures hold specifically in the case of the Alice books.
