Paper: Ethics: Indian and Western

Paper code: PHIHMD01T

Cross cutting issue: Human Values

This course is meant for inter disciplinary students. Students of other departments come to know about the ethical views of Indian and western traditions. They learn about the basic differences between Indian and Western ethical theories, basic concept of Indian moral theories. They acquire the knowledge of ethical theories of Nastika schools of Indian Philosophy: Carvaka, Buddhist and Jainas. They even come to know about some of the significant western ethical theories. Hence, through this course students gain knowledge of human values both from western and Indian perspectives

Paper : Media Ethics

Cross cutting issue : Professional Ethics

Media Ethics is a study of ethical principles and standards of media including broad-cast media, film, theatre etc. Media Ethics also includes issues such as impartiality, objectivity, bias, privacy and the public interest, freedom of speech etc. Through this course, students learn how to behave or express themselves. This course is a part of professional ethics, which promotes values like trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, self-restraint etc.

Cross cutting issue: Professional Ethics and Environmental issue

The course enables the students to know the importance of applying morality in business. This is a part of professional ethics, because it helps the students to know about the ways in which the students interact with clients, colleagues and the community. This helps to prevent unethical behaviour and promote honesty in work place. This course also discusses how advertising ethics is related to business.

This course also promotes environmental issues since it promotes relations that holds between Environmental ethics and business. Through this course, students come to know how business can affect our environment. Hence, a company or business must have the responsibilities to protect our environment. Thus, Environmental ethics in business can reduce negative environmental impacts
